



### R POWERFUL CHRMPIONSHIP

The 2021 Bowling Green Hot Rods team was one for the record books. The team set multiple records in a shortened season and took home their second league championship in three years.

The Hot Rods started the season in Greenville against the Drive and rocketed out to a great start. After an opening day rainout, Bowling Green won their first four games of the year againsty the Drive, outscoring the Red Sox affiliate 38-7 with back-to-back shutouts. Erik Ostberg hit three homers in the series, including a grand slam, while Jacson McGowan hit two in the series, BG started the season 4-2 and was never less than two games over .500 for the rest of the year.

July saw the Hot Rods win 11-straight games with a sweep of Winston-Salem and a near-sweep of the Rome Braves. The club saw their record improve to 55-22 over the month while pitchers like Tanner Dodson. Jayden Murray, Jacob Lopez, and Colby

White continued to shine on the mound. The likes of John Doxakis and Trevor Brigden bolstered the Hot Rods pitching staff as more and more players were promoted to AA Montgomery, but the turnover did little to slow the team.

Hitters like Ruben Cardenas, Greg Jones, and Niko Hulsizer provided boosts with their bats to the offense. Cardenas batted .368 over 30 games with 10 homers while Hulsizer, who started slow, came around to hit 13 long balls while batting .248 prior to promotions. The center pieces to the 2021 offense stayed the entire year and were fantastic. Jordan Osar set a new team. record with 23 homers in a season while steadily batting .257 and leading the club with 88 hits. Grant Witherspoon tied the old team record with 22 homers, posting a .269 average with a team-high 70 RBIs and 13 stolen bases. Evan Edwards also tied the old record with 22 homers of his own. Nine players (Qsar, Witherspoon, Edwards, McGowan, Hill Alexander, Hulsizer, Jones,

> Ostberg, and Cardenas) hit 10 or more homers over the season. en route to destroying the team record with 197 collective long halls

After a hard-fought August where the team lost a season-high 11 games, the Hot Rods came out firing in September. They swept the Hickory Crawdads in Bowling Green and took four of six from Winston-Salem on the road. The season closed out with three wins





amidst some weather issues against Wilmington to set up the league championship series with the Greensboro Grasshoppers.

The series featured the league's two best teams and the best offenses with the Grasshoppers and Hot Rods with the

best-of-five set beginning in Greensboro. After a two-day layover thanks to rain, the series started with a high-scoring affair that went Bowling Green's way. Edwards, who is from Greensboro, and Witherspoon each homered and the Hot Rods came back

in the ninth to win 10-8. The Grasshoppers bounced back, taking a 2-1 series lead heading into game four.



### Bowling

Green held on in game four for a 7-5 win thanks to big-time pitching from Angel Felipe and Michael Costanzo out of the bullpen, while Witherspoon continued to push the envelope on offense. Osar homered for the third time in the series to set up a winner-take-all game five at Bowling Green Ballpark.

With the pitching staff taxed, Jose Lopez got the start in the series finale and gave the Hot Rods a huge boost. The southpaw tossed 3.0 scoreless frames with four strikeouts. Bowling Green got on the board in the first inning with Witherspoon's third homer of the series, a solo shot, before Greensboro took a 2-1 lead in the fourth.

That was short lived for the Grasshoppers thanks to a four-hit, five-run inning in the bottom of the frame. The first three hitters got on in order before Qsar singled home two runs to put the Hot Rods back in front. Ostberg doubled home another and Roberto Alvarez brought home two with a single to give BG a 6-2 lead. Trey Cumbie threw 3.1 innings without allowing a run before Zack Trageton finished the final 2.2 frames, capping off a championship for the Hot Rods.

Bowling Green finished the season with

an 82-36 record, the sixth 80+ win season in club history. It was also the thirdstraight such campaign. Because

of constant roster turnover and quickly changing league landscapes from year to year in the minors, it's incredibly hard to be a consistent winner. With four consecutive playoff berths and two championships in three years, it begs the question: is there a Minor League dynasty in the Vette City?

### BOWLING GREEN BALLPARK

Following Major League Baseball's acquisition of Minor League Baseball, new quidelines were put in place to raise facility standards across the country for team facilities to help improve performance and development. Those changes reached far and wide, but the Bowling Green Hot Rods, city of Bowling Green, and the Tampa Bay Rays quickly rose to the occasion.

Bowling Green Ballpark underwent rapid change this offseason to improve facilities for the team and fans. The Hot Rods were the first club in the country to submit plans to restructure their clubhouse, performance facility, and other parts of the ballpark.

The clubhouse underwent massive changes, adding onto the original structure while modifying existing pieces. Where parking spaces were once lined, a new entryway and kitchen were constructed. The manager's offices have been expanded and include room for team meetings to take place while additional room in the assistant coach's locker room was made. The training room was upgraded to improve player treatment and recovery and a women's locker room was added to accommodate the growing population of women now coaching and umpiring in the professional ranks. The visitor's clubhouse saw similar upgrades and changes, as well.

One of the largest upgrades from the project was in the performance center across the parking lot. The hitting tunnel was expanded from one cage to two and includes a mound for pitchers to throw from. The cages open up to a large strength and

conditioning area that is totally new, and a large upgrade from the weight room previously housed in the clubhouse. There's also a new video room in the performance center that includes offices for staff and an area for players and staff to review footage from games.

A new grounds shop has been constructed and includes coverage for materials vital to maintaining the playing surface at Bowling Green Ballpark. Another large undertaking happened on the field this season, and fans will surely take notice. Brand new LED lights will now illuminate the field and bring a new ambiance to the ballpark.

The final project was completed down the left-field line. The Happy Hiller Corner has totally changed with all seatbacks having been removed. In their place, high-top bar-like tables with unattached chairs. The Hiller Corner is now one of the most unique seating areas in the South Atlantic League and a great place to catch the game or a foul ball.

The Bowling Green Hot Rods continue to look for new ways to improve the ballpark, player experience, and fan experience. 2022's upgrades are the second time the ballpark underwent large changes, with the others being after the 2018 season. These included a new video board, completion of a 360-degree concourse, an upgrade to the Performance Food Service Club and suites, and the addition of MiLB.TV. Thanks to the city of Bowling Green, the Hot Rods and the city continue to improve the facility and ensure baseball will stay in the Vette City for years to come.

Brundage hit eight homers with Charleston while owning the third-highest average on the team (.360). Beau's father, Dave Brundage, has been a Minor League manager for over 20 years. Brundage previously played with Bowling Green in 2019 when the Hot Rods were a low-A team.

A fifth-year pro getting his first full season of Minor League Ball, Dacosta is a crafty left-hander coming off of his best year in professional baseball. The 22-year-old set career highs across the board, splitting time between the bullpen and starting rotation for the FCL Rays and Charleston River Dogs. Recorded his first career save in his only opportunity in the FCL while posting a 3.05 ERA with 51 strikeouts with the Low-A East champion River Dogs.

A highly-touted left-handed starter out of Texas A&M, Doxakis earned Low-A Pitcher of the Week award after his first career start with a full-season team in Charleston, and finished off his first month with the River Dogs as the Pitcher of the Month. Earned the call-up to Bowling Green after striking out 42 hitters in 29.2 innings with Charleston last season.

The left-hand hitting backstop was a key part in the Charleston Riverdogs success in the regular season during 2021 and came to Bowling Green to play in 24 games. Driscoll was a Competitive Balance Round B pick by the San Diego Padres in 2019 before being traded to the Rays along with Manuel Margot for Emilio Pagan.

Dryer showcased pinpoint control in his rookie season, throwing 55 of 57 pitches for strikes over nine innings in the FCL last season. Dryer was a two-way player in high school, hitting .416 his senior season and setting Rockwood Summit High School's career record in runs scored and stolen bases.

Dyer joins the Hot Rods after spending his first year in the Rays system with the Charleston Riverdogs. A product of Arizona, the New York Mets drafted the versatile catcher/outfielder/first baseman in the fourth round of the 2020 draft and then traded him a year later the the Tampa Bay Rays. He hit 12 homers between two teams during the 2021 season.

Hiott played with the Charleston RiverDogs in 2021 and won a championship. Hiott set career-highs with five doubles and six homers and hit .337 prior to an injury that kept him out most of the month of August. Hiott shares a birthday with baseball legend Satchel Paige.

Infante spent most of 2021 with the Charleston RiverDogs and finished it with the Hot Rods. He played in 101 games for the Low-A East champions, batting .296 with 16 homers, including two four-hit games. Infante signed with the Rays and an international free agent in 2016.

The converted shortstop enjoyed a breakout season in 2021 after finishing his rookie year in 2019 with four shutout innings in Princeton, becoming a key starter in the River Dogs' championship run. Johnson started off 2022 as the Rays' number eight prospect, the third-highest ranked starting pitcher.

Did not allow a run in his first professional season, earning two saves in two opportunities in 6.1 innings with the FCL Rays. Drafted in the eleventh round of the 2021 draft by the Rays after earning Pac-12 All-Conference Honors and ABCA All-West Region team with the Bruins in 2021. During the pandemic, he won the 2020 National Baseball Congress World Series with the Santa Barbara Foresters, posting a 1.12 ERA with 26 strikeouts in 16 innings.
